Care for the land, care for people, go forward.*



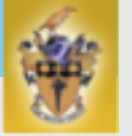

## Board of Trustee Position

Jo Sturgeon has left our Board of Trustees and we thank her for her time and effort as a Parent Representative on our Board.

Due to Jo's leaving, we now have a vacancy on the Board and want you to think about whether you would like to join us or find out more about Board of Trustees and how they work. Please have a think about it and talk to a Board member or Vicki Walker, our Chairperson. If you would like more information, ask Josie at the Office.

### What do trustees do?

First and foremost a board is accountable for student progress and achievement to its parents, community and the Crown. The board has overall responsibility and accountability for the school or kura. The legal responsibilities of the boards of trustees are determined by the Education Act of 1989. Section 75 of the Act outlines the functions and powers of boards:

A school's board must perform its functions and exercise its powers in such a way as to ensure that every student at the school is able to attain his or her highest possible standard in educational achievement.

### Here are some of the specific things boards do:

Set the strategic direction and long-term plans for the school or kura in consultation with the school or kura's community.

Monitor the board's progress against the charter goals and targets.  
Monitor and evaluate student progress and achievement.  
Oversee the management of staff, property, finances curriculum and administration.

Ensure that government priorities are met.

Fulfil the intent of the Treaty of Waitangi by valuing and reflecting New Zealand's dual cultural heritage.

Act as good employers to all staff at the school or kura.

**Parklands School Motueka:**

**Scratch and MBot Robotics, 9-11 July:** This three day course is divided up into 3 different days, Day 1 is designed for people who have limited programming experience. This course is for all age levels-from 5 to 99! Days 2-3, students will learn how to programme MBot robots using a similar coding programme. This course is designed for students with a little programming experience (Day 1 is sufficient) and for students aged 9+.

**Quilling Art, 9 July:** This 3 hour course is in the ancient art of paper quilling. Learn how to roll paper strips into intricate patterns and then form them into patterns and shapes. This course is designed for ages 10+.

**Cooking, 9-11 July:** Come along and learn how to cook fantastic meals and compete in cooking challenges. Who will be the top chef? This three day course is designed for students aged 6+.

**Ozobot Coding, 9-10 July:** Come along and learn how to use colour and patterns to programme a robot to do what you want it to do! This creative, hands-on course is designed for ages 7-10.

**Ozobot Coding, 16-17 July:** Come along and learn how to use colour and patterns to programme a robot to do what you want it to do! This creative, hands-on course is designed for ages 7-10.

**Scratch and MBot Robotics, 16-19 July:** This four day course is divided up into different parts, Day 1 is designed for people who have limited programming experience. **Magic the Gathering-Two Headed Giant! 16 July:** This is for students aged 9+ that have experience playing Magic the Gathering. Students will be learning a new gaming format and competing in teams against other teams.

**Art and Engineering, 18-20 July:** This very hands-on course combines art with science and engineering. Students learn the science and design skills while creating different aspects of art. This is a messy course designed for students aged 6+.
